How would you explain hell to people?	So does this mean that hell will be a tolerable place for the wicked?
The Bible gives a number of descriptions of hell, or the place of final judgment:	3:17-18 – What do these verses have to say about why there will be people spending eternity in hell?
Will the unbelieving dead become non-existent?	3:18 – Why does it say that those who do not believe, do not believe in the <u>name</u> of the Son of God?
3:16 – Why did the Father send the Son into the world?	3:19 – What condemns those who are condemned to hell?
Does this say that since God loved the world that all people in the world would have everlasting life?	Why do most people choose to remain in their sin?
What does it mean to believe in the Son?	3:20 – What do people who have embraced their sinful condition think of the revelation of God?
If God so loved the world how could He allow people to go to hell?	3:21 – What do people who are honest with themselves do?
How does the fact that people were made in the image of God help us see why there will be those that will end up in hell?	Does this mean that our own actions are what save us?
Another aspect of our being made in the image of God is that all people will live into eternal future. How does this demand that there be a place for people who reject a relationship with God?	What action should a person take who has never been saved?
