John 7:1-7

7:1 – Why did Jesus stay in Galilee, was He afraid of being taken by the Jewish religious leaders?	What guidelines does God give us for the right use of time in Ephesians 5:15-21?  Ephesians 5:15-21 - <sup>15</sup> Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, <sup>16</sup> making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil. <sup>17</sup> Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is.
Given that Jesus waited on God's timing in Galilee, how should we know if we should also wait or take action?	<sup>18</sup> Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit. <sup>19</sup> Speak to one another with psalms, hymns and spiritual songs. Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord, <sup>20</sup> always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>21</sup> Submit to one another out of

What does it mean to sing and make melody in your heart to the Lord?	What does the world think of Christians?
How can we give thanks always for all things?	How should we respond to the rejection we encounter in the world?
Why should we submit to each other out of reverence for Christ?	
How is it that we can gain control of our life by yielding to the Holy Spirit?	
How do we apply what we've learned about being filled with the Spirit in our daily activities?
